August 28th Club Picnic at Murray Park. The award form is attached to fill out and return to Catherine.


VOLUNTEERS




STEP 1: Stand with your legs wide apart and your dog in a stand-stay behind you. Hold a treat in your hand and reach through your legs and toward your dog. Then lure your dog to follow the treat through your legs.

STEP 2: Deliver the lure slightly in front of you so that your dog peeks his head through your legs. Name the trick "Peekaboo."

STEP 3: Say the trick name earlier and earlier to your dog's motion, until you can use the name to start the cure instead of the lure. Once your dog is fluent with this step, start with your legs a bit closer together.

Once they mastered the Peekaboo with just walking through your legs. Add the additional command of Peekaboo Sit.





Frozen Peanut Butter Yogurt Dog Treats

PREP TIME	FREEZING TIME	TOTAL TIME
5 mins	4 hours	4 hours 5 mins

INGREDIENTS

- ½ cups sugar free Peanut Butter
- ½ cup live coconut yogurt or Greek yogurt

INSTRUCTIONS

- In a medium bowl, mix the peanut butter and yogurt until smooth.
- Spoon the mixture into an ice cube tray or silicone dog treat mold.
- Freeze for 4 hours.



Avoiding Close Encounters of The Slithering Kind

The weather is so delightful, but the snakes are so frightful. 150,000 pets are bitten by Rattlesnakes every year. How do you avoid it happening to your furry friend? Here are tips to keep you and your dog safe.

- While out walking, controlling your dog with a 6-foot leash may be your best safety device.
- Do not allow your dog to explore holes in the ground or dig under logs, flat rocks, or planks. (I know that is hard for our tracking and scent pups.)
- Stay on open paths where there is an opportunity for snakes to be visible.
- Keep nighttime walks to a minimum, rattlers are nocturnal most of the year.
- If you hear a rattlesnake, keep your dog at your side until you locate the snake and then move
- Act fast in case of a bite. Symptoms of a bite may include:
 - Lethargy
 - Collapse or weakness
 - Trembling or muscle twitching
 - Vomiting or diarrhea
 - Excessive drooling or frothing
 - o Blood in urine
 - Paralysis
 - Dilated pupils
 - o Puncture wounds
 - Extreme swelling
 - Seizures
 - Difficulty breathing
- Get the Rattlesnake Vaccine. (I have only found one clinic that had the vaccine available. Their name is University Veterinary Hospital.)
